The Open Doors Mentorship Program hosts Billie Nell's contemporary, queer horror *The Remembering (Ottawa, Canada)* in a reimagining of Mary Shelley's 'Frankenstein'; Last year's outstanding Best of Fest performance by PUSH Physical Theatre, *Generic Male: Just What We Need, Another Show About Men (Rochester, USA)*, returns with their show that is often described as "Cirque du Soleil meets Samuel Beckett with a dash of Monty Python"; From Spoon Fulla Sugar, comedian, academy award nominated actress and ex-flight attendant Aliya Kanani, takes us on a journey around the world, with tales of fitting in, sticking out and standing up with *Aliya Kanani: Where You From, From? The Ottawa Fringe is an **open access festival where 100% of ticket sales go to the artists**. Nobody curates the Ottawa Fringe Festival. Ottawa Fringe rents the venues and programs the festival by **lottery**. Every show is independently produced and more artists get into the program by submitting a Bring Your Own Venue show (**BYOV**). Since 1997, the Ottawa Fringe Festival has returned more than **\$2 million** to independent artists.
